Director's Note...

What is community? What does it mean to be neighborly? How do we protect ourselves and our loved ones from the outside world and the dangers that lurk? Steve Yockey's *Bellwether* offers a glimpse into a seemingly perfect suburban neighborhood, only to reveal the unsettling darkness lurking just beneath its surface. At its core, this play examines the delicate facade of normalcy that communities like Bellwether create and the deep fractures that emerge when tragedy strikes.

This story challenges our reality and explores representations of the repressed fears of the community of Bellwether and the fallout from neglected relationships, self preservation, and our own self motivated choices. Through the manifestation of the anxieties that we, as individuals and as a society, are often too afraid to confront, the play asks the question: what is the real threat to our security? Is it mysterious figures from our nightmares, or could it actually be us—our own prejudices, our fears, our self interests, our mistrust of those in our lives?

As we stand at a moment in history defined by societal fragmentation, *Bellwether* holds up a mirror to the ways we place ourselves in echo chambers, mistrust each other, keep a close watch on those around us, and let media-driven narratives fuel our doubts and the intentions of others.

Our hope is that this play will leave you questioning not just the events on stage, but the role we all play in shaping the narratives of our own lives and communities. Have we ever, knowingly or unknowingly, been the ones sowing fear? Have we been the ones lurking in the shadows, letting our own unresolved emotions drive us to judge others unfairly? And, do we come together as a community to protect the ones we love, or is it every individual out for themself?

By entering this production, our theater department is sharing in the KCACTF goals to recognize, reward, and celebrate the exemplary work produced in college and university theaters across the nation.
